Directions: Number all paragraphs (including the sentence at the top of the second page which counts as paragraph #4). Then work together as a group to answer the following questions. Take turns being the scribe.

1. What do you notice about Paragraph #1?

2. What words or phrases in Paragraph #2 let you know that the reviewer liked "The Houdini Box"?

3. What other literary works does the reviewer reference in Paragraph #5?

4. Do you think this reviewer "gets personal"? If so, give examples of "personal" writing including the paragraph # in which you find it.

5. Do you think this reviewer uses "conversational" writing? If so, give examples of "conversational" writing including paragraph # in which you find it.

6. Are there any examples of the reviewer being especially "honest"? If so, give examples of this "honest" writing including paragraph # in which you find it.

7. How many direct quotes from Hugo Cabret does the reviewer use? List the paragraph numbers in which you find these direct quotes.
8. In which paragraph is the title of the book ("The Invention of Hugo Cabret") mentioned for the first time?
9. How many times is a title of a book (any book) included in the review? What do you notice about how these titles are listed?
10. What additional information (based on research rather than the reading of the book itself) does the reviewer include? List the paragraph # in which you found this additional information.
11. Do you think there is more summary, review, or promotion in this review? (Feel free to highlight if that helps you decide.) Explain why you feel the way you do.
